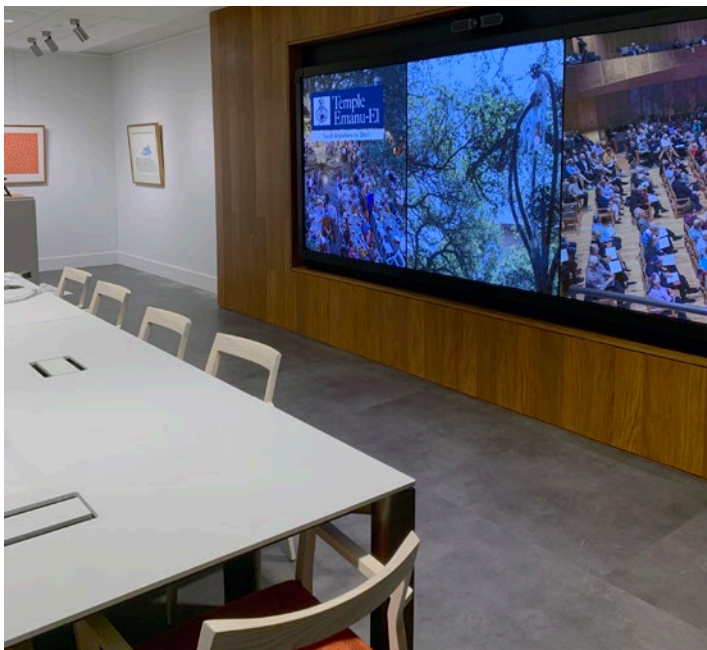
ROOTS AND BRANCHES: CHRISTY AND ADAM BLUMENFELD AND FAMILY TREE PLANTING

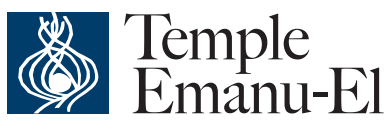


BARBARA ZALE CENTER FOR LIVING HISTORY
